WHAT HAVE WE RECENTLY ACHIEVED?

After the Second Transnational Partner Meeting in February 2019 in Poland, ISQ, BWC, KHEM and Hub Karelia worked hard to produce learning content for the 'The Lay Family Health Advisors Curriculum' in order to build the skills, knowledge and competences identified in the curriculum framework.

FIP and INNEO produced all 36 media-rich mini-learning format resources in English.

The instant access to the full suite of learning resources you will find in the online learning portal developed by Hub Karelia.

In addition, BWC, AKLUB and DANTE are currently developing the Induction Training Programme which is designed to support the delivery of the new curriculum.



COMING NEXT...

Our work on the project will continue:

- AKLUB, INNEO, DANTE, KHEM, Hub Karelia and ISQ will be responsible for translating the curriculum materials for IO1, the learning content for the induction training resources from IO2 and the learning content for the resources of IO3, as well as recording the necessary audio files, in all partner languages.
- Hub Karelia will complete all development work on the portal and upload all training content.
- The next Transnational Partner Meeting is scheduled to be held in May 2020 in Kas, Turkey



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THE THIRD TRANSNATIONAL PARTNER MEETING IN CROATIA



MEETING IN RIJEKA, CROATIA

Members of the ON-CALL PROJECT met for the Third Transnational Partner Meeting on 10th – 11th of September 2019 in Rijeka, Croatia.

THE HOSTING PARTNER

The Third Transnational Project Meeting of the Neuro-Guide Project was organized by the Croatian partner – **DANTE** (The Adult Education Institution Dante).

DANTE – is an Institution, based in Rijeka (Croatia). The Institution is designed to respond to the needs of modern society, contributing to the sustainable development of adult education at the regional, national and European level.

THE MEETING'S SCHEDULE

The consortium of the ON-CALL project met for the third time. The meeting started with the general introductions and greetings. Next, following the agreed schedule, partners made a short review of the project outputs, objectives and methodology.

A large part of the meeting was dedicated to discussion on the resources developed by the ON-CALL partnership in previous months.

Then partners agreed the approach and set the implementation dates for next transnational meeting and Skype meetings, the duration and the exact content of the planned Multiplier Events.

Time was also spent on planning the next steps of the project's development, on the dissemination of the products developed so far, and what action is needed to further improve the quality, effectiveness and impact of development co-operation.

ISQ conducted the first Impact Assessment exercise at the meeting.

HEALTH LITERACY FESTIVALS

Each partner will host a Health Literacy Festival to promote health literacy and the tools and resources developed. A minimum of 25 newly trained Lay Family Health Advisors in each partner country will attend this event and begin their journey toward health literacy. These target groups will have a deep understanding of the project and its outputs and will act as advocates for the project in the wider adult education, community development and health promotion sectors in the local areas where partners are based.

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FINAL CONFERENCE

A Final Conference will be held in Northern Ireland at the end of the project to present full suite of materials developed and testimonials from partner's countries. A minimum of 80 adult education professionals and managers will attend the final conference. The main objective of this event will be to encourage other community development organisations providing services to disadvantaged communities to engage with and use the full suite of resources



TRANSNATIONAL TRAINING EVENT

The training will comprise a total of 60 hours of learning:

- 20 hours of workshop-based facilitated learning;
- 20 hours of self-directed learning;
- 20 hours of face-to-face instruction.

3-day Transnational Training Event will take place in Portugal to be attended by 16 adult educators from 8 different countries to come together and form a transnational community of practice focused on promoting health literacy within disadvantaged communities.
